



Poster Guidelines 8th Annual Meeting EPIZONE

Access to posters

If you submit your poster in PDF format (by email to mage@vet.dtu.dk), it will be made available on the conference homepage after the conference. In order to put the posters on the homepage promptly, we will need a pdf of your poster no later than September 25th. The pdf-file should be named using the surname of the first author, and if you are a Young EPIZONE member, please indicate this by writing YE_ in the beginning of the file name.

Poster prizes

Poster prizes will be awarded to the two best posters elected by a jury, 1 prize will be for the best poster from a Young EPIZONE member and 1 will be selected from amongst all the posters.

Poster tours

Two poster sessions are planned for Wednesday afternoon, including poster tours. Please, sign up (by email to the organizer of the poster tour Anette Boklund: ANEBO@vet.dtu.dk) for the poster tours if you are interested in presenting your poster in a 2-3 minute time slot. Each poster tour will last for approximately 20-30 minutes, with 5-6 posters being presented in each tour. If many people wish to do this, then the organizers will select the posters that will be presented in this way; the presenters will be informed.

General advice

- Posters should be easily read from a distance of approximately 2 meters
- It should be possible to read and comprehend the main subject of the poster easily and quickly
- Each poster will be allocated display space on poster boards of 118 cm width x 158 cm height
- Lettering should be in dark, contrasting colors
- Do not use combinations of red and green – check this link for colors difficult for people with color blindness, <http://www.vischeck.com/vischeck/vischeckImage.php>
- Minimize the amount of text and tables, prioritize figures and pictures
- Please bring handouts of the poster in A4-size
- Include a photo of the author attending the conference, so that delegates can easily recognize the presenting author.
